

## Oral French Conversation Likes and Dislikes



You will have one period to prepare but not memorize a short statement (1- 1.5 min) about you likes or dislikes related to; sports, entertainment, food, clothing. You will ensure you know how to greet and say good bye to someone. You will make sure you know how to pose 3 - 4 questions about a topic using phrases we have practiced in class.

Meet with your partner.



First greet each other and ask about each other's well being.

Ask 3 - 4 related questions about your partner's likes or dislikes in regards to food, sports activities or clothing or entertainment.



Exchange preferences about the topic. Offer reasons for your views and and/or explain why you agree or disagree.

The partner listening responds showing you understand what is being said and whether you agree or disagree. (Tu es tres sportif! J'aime aussi le baseball.)

The other partner shares their likes or dislikes.

Close with an appropriate leave taking.



### Critères de succès

- ☺ I use appropriate vocabulary to greet my partner.
- ☺ I ask 3 - 4 clear questions about my partner's likes or dislikes related to \_\_\_\_\_
- ☺ I respond to my partner's views using a good sentence.
- ☺ I share my likes or dislikes with my partner in 3-4 clear sentences.
- ☺ I offer a leave taking phrase.

## Oral Communication Rubric Likes and Dislikes
